3. The Westmorland County Agricultural Society privacy policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, that you provide to us or that we may receive from others about you will be processed by us. It includes data that we hold electronically and in paper files. Names, limited address particulars and details of entries will be published in the catalogue of entries and passed to our printers, solely for the purpose of compiling the catalogue. Results information may be published (in printed form and online) and provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information relating to Exhibitors and their animals may be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA), British Cattle Movement Service (BCMS), SAC, Breed Societies, County Councils, Veterinary Advisors and others who have regulatory access. All exhibitors are asked to take careful note of the various starting times of their classes. No substitutions allowed (except Show Jumping).

There are **NO OVERNIGHT** parking facilities for horses on the Showground in the light horse parking area (Gate J). Should overnight facilities be required please contact the Show Office for contact details of alternative facilities on the Showground and/or local stabling.

Gates to the light horse parking area (Gate J) will not open until **6.00am**.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: This applies to all ridden competitions, jumping, demonstrations, practice, collecting areas and whilst exercising. All riders of horses or ponies on the Showground or exercise areas are required to wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats which conforms to the following standards for head protection for equestrian activities: *All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards; Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover.* Refer to your Society/Association Rule Book for further clarification.

For the health and safety of all exhibitors, **horses must not be tied to the side of Horse Boxes.**

No Dogs or Pushchairs in Horse Walkways.

Numbers of entries per class will be posted on Westmorland County Agricultural Society website and Facebook page from 6 September 2018.

Classes will **not be delayed** for any reason.

EQUINE WELFARE is of paramount importance and all riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks, the Society reserves the right to take further action against any competitor whose size or weight compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden; this would be based on the recommendations of the on-site Animal Welfare Officer.

EXHIBITOR TICKETS: will be despatched no later than 30 August 2018.

Exhibitor tickets to be issued on the basis of 1 admission ticket per horse/rider combination plus one ticket for the exhibitor, to a maximum 5 tickets per exhibitor. Exhibitors may apply for additional tickets for their family/friends at the discounted rate of £12.00, subject to being purchased on or before the closing date for entries. Maximum 4 extra tickets per exhibitor.

SHOW PONY/HUNTER SECTION

Judging/ General Conditions

These classes are open to non-BSPS members, however, this show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and all persons entering, competing, or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS, are subject to the constitution and rules of the BSPS, including their disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS. **BSPS Registered Number is BSPS 154/18.** A copy of the constitution and rules is available upon request at the Stewards marquee on Show Day.

Lead rein classes must be shown in SNAFFLE BRIDLES only and the attendant MUST FIX THE LEAD REIN TO THE NOSEBAND.

First ridden ponies must be shown in SNAFFLE BRIDLES only.

JUDGE: Miss R Hargreaves, Lancaster

Class 1 Lead Rein Pony. 4 years old and upwards, not exceeding 122cms (12.0 hh) to be led, rider not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

Class 2 First Ridden Pony. 4 years old and upwards not exceeding 122cms (12.0 hh) ridden by girl or boy, not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year. Pony to be ridden off the lead rein.

Class 3 Open Show Pony, mixed height. Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 148cms. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride.

Class 4 Open Lead Rein Pony of the Hunter Type. 4 years old or over, not exceeding 122cms (12.0hh) to be led. Rider not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

Class 5 Open Show Hunter Pony, mixed height. Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 153cms. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride.

SPECIALS: PONY CHAMPIONSHIP – Winners of Classes 1 – 2 to compete. 1st and 2nd prizewinners only to be eligible. The Champion will qualify for the BSPS Champion of Champions.

Class 12 The BSPS Heritage Mountain and Moorland Open Lead Rein – Mare or gelding 4 years old or over not exceeding 122cm. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1 January in the current year. Snaffle bridles only, the attendant must fix the lead rein to the noseband only.

SECTION A – Fell Ponies

JUDGE: Mrs R Williams, Crook

Class 14 Brood mare with own foal at foot. All Foals must be a minimum of 4 weeks old on Show Day.

Class 15 Foal, the progeny of mare in Class 14

Class 16 Fell pony mare, not eligible for Class 14, or gelding four years old and over not ridden

Class 17 Fell pony yearling filly, colt or gelding

Class 18 Fell pony colt, gelding or filly, two or three years old

If there are insufficient entries in classes 17 and 18, the Society reserves the right to amalgamate them

Class 19 Registered Fell Pony, four years old and upwards to be brought into the ring mounted. Judging will be based on 50% for conformation and 50% for ride and manners.

PRIZES: **STOTT PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP** (LH55) – Presented in memory of the late Mr C. G. Stott for the Champion Fell Pony from classes 14-19

PACKWAY FELL PONY PERPETUAL TROPHY (LH54) – Presented in memory of Miss Peggy Crossland to the winner of Class 14

TARNBECK MAYDEW MEMORIAL PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY AND TARNBECK TROPHY ROSETTE (LH55A) – Presented by the Williamson family to the winner of Class 19 for the Best Ridden

FELL PONY BREEDER'S ASSOCIATION GOLD SHIELD ROSETTE – card to be presented to the highest place pony in Class 19 which is current member of the FPBA and which has not won this award in a previous show in 2018. The rosettes will be presented at the FPBA meeting later in the year.

SECTION B – Shetland Ponies

Ponies entering must be registered with the Shetland Pony Stud Book Society and must be named on the entry form. Height limit: Four years old and over must not exceed 42 inches.

There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or stallions in In-hand classes. Children under 11 yrs old (on the day of the show) may not show stallions in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 yrs or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, & take no further part.

Class 21 Standard stallion 4 years old or over

Class 22 Standard brood mare 4 years old or over with own foal at foot. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on Show Day.

Class 23 Foal, the progeny of standard mare in Class 22 and must be a minimum of three weeks old on Show Day

Class 24 Standard mare not eligible for Class 22, or gelding, 4 years old or over

Class 25 Standard colt, filly or gelding, 2 or 3 years old

Class 26 Standard yearling filly, colt or gelding

Class 27 Miniature stallion 4 years old or over

Class 28 Miniature brood mare 4 years old or over with own foal at foot. All foals must be a minimum of 3 weeks old on Show Day.

Class 29 Miniature foal, the progeny of miniature mare in Class 28 and must be a minimum of 3 weeks old on Show Day

Class 30 Miniature mare not eligible for Class 28, or gelding 4 years old & over

Class 31 Miniature colt, filly or gelding 2 or 3 years old

Class 32 Miniature yearling filly, colt or gelding

Class 33 Mare or Gelding 4 years old or over to be shown ridden on or off lead rein

Class 34 **HUTTON PROGENY CUP** (LH56) – Entries must be pre-entered. No entry fee, no prize money – Presented by Miss Amy Edge for the Mare or Stallion and 2 of their progeny or 3 ponies out of the same Mare or by the same Stallion. All progeny to be bred by the Exhibitor and been exhibited in the above classes.

RIDDEN HORSE SECTION

The Westmorland Agricultural Society is affiliated to The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. All exhibitors (ie riders and horses) in Classes 42 - 49 must be registered with the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain and must be on 2018 show hunter register, competitors must quote their registration numbers on the entry form. **Day Ticket = £35** (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 show's in the year – it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for that show). If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

Classes 35, 38 – 49 are held under the rules of the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. Grooms are reminded that although the Sport Horse Society has no set rules on dress code, they should be of smart appearance and wear hats.

Classes 42 – 49 Headwear – see general rules.

All Hunter Classes will be judged under the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain 2018 rules. The 2018 SHB (GB) Rule Book is available at the Stewards' marquee.

SHB(GB) IN THE NORTH WEST – RIDDEN POINTS COMPETITION

The following classes at the show: WORKING HUNTER; RIDDEN SPORT HORSE; RIDDEN HUNTER; RIDDEN IRISH DRAUGHT, are included in the S.H.B.(G.B) in the North West Ridden Points Competition. Points will be awarded to 1st – 4th places in each class. Horses can compete in any of the above classes. An award will be made to the horse attaining the highest number of points overall. Conditions of Competition

1. The Exhibitor must in all cases be the owner of the animal shown (see Rule 23).
2. The ENTRY LIST for all entries will close on Monday 20th AUGUST 2018. No late entries will be accepted. Poultry, Alpacas, Light Horse, Showjumping & Lowland Flocks excepted.
3. No animal can be shown in more than one Class, nor shall one animal take more than one Prize. Group and Special Prizes and Light Horses excepted.
4. Bulls must be led and ringed at the nose. Animals entering the show-ground area, in all respects, are at the risk of the owner. The Society will not be responsible for any accident which may occur through any animal exhibited, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. You are strongly advised to check your insurance cover on this point.
5. All Prizewinners in the Cattle Classes must take part in the Parade of Prize Animals or the Prizes will be withheld.
6. In order to discourage frivolous protests, every protest must be made in writing and sent to the Secretary within seven clear days after the date of the Show, and to be accompanied by a deposit of £50 to be returned, or retained, by the vote of the Committee, on consideration as to whether there was reasonable ground or not for the protest.
7. The Conditions attached to any Premium are applicable to all animals gaining a prize of whatever denomination.
8. If only one entry is received in any section, this section may be withdrawn. The entrant will be notified and the entry fee returned.
9. The winners of Cups, Trophies and/or Plaques must return them to the Society's office at Lane Farm or to the Society's appointed Jeweller, Mr W Philip, 6 Collin Hill, Kendal, on or before 1st July within the year following the Show, or in default of this requirement a penalty of £25 will be imposed.

These cups, etc, shall be the responsibility of the winner until they are in the hands of the Society or its appointed Jeweller. Proof of posting will be required if an article is lost or alleged to be lost in the post.
10. All cups should be considered to be 'perpetual' unless stated otherwise.
11. All exhibitors will be subject to the orders of the Society's officials. Abuse, physical or verbal, towards stewards and staff will not be tolerated and exhibitors or their assistants not obeying the directions of the Society's officers will render themselves liable to expulsion from the Showground.
12. In the event of what is considered by the Management Committee to be a serious contravention of the Rules, not apparent within the 7-day period under condition 6, the 7-day period need not apply.
13. A Disciplinary Committee consisting of the Referee, Chairman, Chief Executive and appropriate Chief Steward is empowered to represent the Society on matters relating to the Show on Show day and their decision shall be binding.
14. All persons entering an animal in a class covered by a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to it's Rules and disciplinary procedures including exclusion from exhibiting.

Extract from Rules of Society

1. This Society, established in 1799, for the purpose of improving the breed of stock and the management and cultivation of farms has for its objects the promotion of the interests of Agriculture in general and to combine and foster the interests of town and country.
- 5.1 Applicants for membership, having paid the current membership subscription, shall on Show Day have the rights and privileges of a member (save voting rights until voting membership is confirmed) and shall otherwise be bound by the rules bylaws and regulations of the Society for the time being.
7. Every subscriber of £27.50 a year and upwards may apply to be a Member of the Society. Subscriptions shall become due and paid by Show Day in each year, and any person whose application has not been approved shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting. No member shall be allowed to withdraw his name without giving notice in writing to the Chief Executive of his intention to do so previous to the 1st December in each year.
13. All conditions of competition framed by the Committee shall be as binding as these Rules, providing the same be in no way at variance therewith.
23. When a Premium or Prize is offered for any animal without expressing that it be in the hands of the Breeder such animal shall have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and located upon their premises for a period of not less than three calendar months immediately preceding the Show Day. Horses, sheep and pigs excepted.
24. No person (except in the case of a son succeeding his father, a widow her husband) shall be admitted to claim for the best managed farm until he has been in bona-fide occupation of such farm for three years at least. The Inspectors in making their awards shall have special regard to the improvements made by the Tenant as distinguished from those made by the Landlord.
25. If a person shall obtain a First Prize in any of the Farms and Stocks classes (classes 1 – 8) for two consecutive years, he shall not be entitled to compete again for the same Prize in the year immediately succeeding the date of the second award; and whenever such person shall again become a competitor, the inspectors shall direct their attention particularly to the improvements made on the farm during the last two years.
26. The word 'Farm' shall mean the entire holding or holdings of the competitor, being either proprietary occupier or tenant, when lying together or farmed from the same homestead, exclusive of woods, roads, rivers and high-lying grounds not adapted for ploughing, and whether or not farmed under different landlords or held under different agreements.
N.B. Inasmuch as it is impossible to frame this Rule so as to meet every case, the Committee shall have power, in the event of dispute to decide each case on its own merits, but in accordance as far as possible with the true intent and spirit of this Rule, and their decisions shall be final.
30. Any member knowingly making any false entry, or otherwise attempting to impose on the Society, shall not be allowed to continue as a member.
