GENERAL

1. All entries must be made on the Show's printed form, or online, and be accompanied by the appropriate remittance for the classes entered.
2. Members of the Society and Subscribers paying £27.50 or more will receive a badge which gives admission to the Show and to the Members' Terrace.
3. The Westmorland County Agricultural Society privacy policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, that you provide to us or that we may receive from others about you will be processed by us. It includes data that we hold electronically and in paper files. Names, limited address particulars and details of entries will be published in the catalogue of entries and passed to our printers, solely for the purpose of compiling the catalogue. Results information may be published (in printed form and online) and provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information relating to Exhibitors and their animals may be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA), British Cattle Movement Service (BCMS), SAC, Breed Societies, County Councils, Veterinary Advisors and others who have regulatory access. Please refer to www.westmorlandshow.co.uk for full details of our Privacy Policy.
4. No late entries – The Chief Executive has strict instructions not to accept any entries received after the respective closing date: Light Horse 15th August 2019.
5. All classes are open with no radius restriction, unless otherwise stated.
6. All exhibitors agree to abide by Rules and Conditions quoted by submitting their Official Entry Form.
7. The Judging of all Classes will commence at the stated times.

8. No animal will be allowed in any Ring, unless the proper numbered card is attached to each exhibit with string or similar.

No late entries – entries received after **THURSDAY 15th AUGUST 2019** will not be accepted. This rule will be strictly enforced. Please help and send your entry early. No refunds will be given following close of entries.

All exhibitors are asked to take careful note of the various starting times of their classes. No substitutions allowed (except Show Jumping).

There are **NO OVERNIGHT** parking facilities for horses on the Showground in the light horse parking area (Gate J). Should overnight facilities be required please contact the Show Office for contact details of alternative facilities on the Showground and/or local stabling.

Gates to the light horse parking area (Gate J) will not open until **6.00am**.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: This applies to all ridden competitions, jumping, demonstrations, practice, collecting areas and whilst exercising. All riders of horses or ponies on the Showground or exercise areas are required to wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats which conforms to the following standards for head protection for equestrian activities: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards; Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your Society/Association Rule Book for further clarification.

For the health and safety of all exhibitors, **horses must not be tied to the side of Horse Boxes. No Dogs or Pushchairs in Horse Walkways.**

Numbers of entries per class will be posted on Westmorland County Agricultural Society website and Facebook page from 5 September 2019.

Classes will **not be delayed** for any reason.

EQUINE WELFARE is of paramount importance and all riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks, the Society reserves the right to take further action against any competitor whose size or weight compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden; this would be based on the recommendations of the on-site Animal Welfare Officer.

EXHIBITOR PASSES: will be despatched no later than 29 August 2019.

Exhibitor passes to be issued on the basis of 1 pass per horse/rider combination plus one pass for the exhibitor, to a maximum 5 passes per exhibitor. Exhibitors may apply for additional tickets for their family and friends at the discounted rate of £12.00, subject to being purchased on or before the closing date for entries. Maximum of 4 tickets per member/exhibitor. All exhibitor passes are non-transferable & non-refundable. No refunds or replacements will be given in respect of any lost, forgotten or unused passes.

Equine Influenza Policy

Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 – 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 – 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

Horses must have been vaccinated within 12 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

Foals

In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born.

Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times.

Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians.

Please note that neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office prior to the event. However, random checks will be carried out on the showground during the show.

TSR Showing Finals

This Show is a qualifier for the 2019 TSR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals **TSR Riders Finals** - 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring. Handlers **MUST** have their cards signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website.

TSR In Hand Finals - The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand Card will qualify in any In Hand class.

Judging/ General Conditions

These classes are open to non-BSPS members, however, this show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and all persons entering, competing, or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS, are subject to the constitution and rules of the BSPS, including their disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS. **BSPS Registered Number is BSPS 42/19.** A copy of the constitution and rules is available upon request at the Stewards marquee on Show Day.

Lead rein classes must be shown in SNAFFLE BRIDLES only and the attendant **MUST FIX THE LEAD REIN TO THE NOSEBAND.**

First ridden ponies must be shown in SNAFFLE BRIDLES only.

Class 1 BSPS Open Lead Rein Pony. 4 years old and upwards, not exceeding 122cms (12.0 hh) to be led, rider not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

Class 2 BSPS Open First Ridden Pony. 4 years old and upwards not exceeding 122cms (12.0 hh) ridden by girl or boy, not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year. Pony to be ridden off the lead rein.

Class 3 BSPS Open Show Pony, mixed height. Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 148cms. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride.

Class 4 BSPS Open Lead Rein Pony of the Hunter Type. 4 years old or over, not exceeding 122cms (12.0hh) to be led. Rider not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

Class 5 BSPS Open Show Hunter Pony, mixed height. Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 153cms. Rider must be the correct age for the height of the pony they ride.

Class 6 BSPS Intermediate Show Riding Type/Show Hunter, mixed height. Mare or Gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 146cm but not exceeding 158cms. Rider not to have attained their 25th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

SPECIALS: PONY CHAMPIONSHIP – Winners of Classes 1 – 2 to compete. 1st and 2nd prizewinners only to be eligible.

Class 24 Fell pony colt, gelding or filly, two or three years old

If there are insufficient entries in classes 23 and 24, the Society reserves the right to amalgamate them

Class 25 Registered Fell Pony, four years old and upwards to be brought into the ring mounted. Judging will be based on 50% for conformation and 50% for ride and manners.

SECTION B – Shetland Ponies

Ponies entering must be registered with the Shetland Pony Stud Book Society and must be named on the entry form. Society Rosettes will only be given to registered Ponies or Foals eligible for registration. Height limit: Four years old and over must not exceed 42 inches. Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on Show day. All Stallions aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc. There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or stallions in In-hand classes. Children under 12 yrs old (on the day of the show) may not show stallions in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 yrs or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, & take no further part.

Class 30 Standard stallion 4 years old or over

Class 31 Standard brood mare 4 years old or over with own foal at foot. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on Show Day.

Class 32 Foal, the progeny of standard mare in Class 31 and must be a minimum of three weeks old on Show Day

Class 33 Standard mare not eligible for Class 31, or gelding, 4 years old or over

Class 34 Standard colt, filly or gelding, 2 or 3 years old

Class 35 Standard yearling filly, colt or gelding

Class 36 Miniature stallion 4 years old or over

Conditions of Competition

1. The Exhibitor must in all cases be the owner of the animal shown (see Rule 23).
2. The ENTRY LIST for all entries will close on Thursday 15th AUGUST 2019. No late entries will be accepted. Poultry, Alpacas, Livestock, Showjumping & Lowland Flocks excepted.
3. No animal can be shown in more than one Class, nor shall one animal take more than one Prize. Group and Special Prizes and Light Horses excepted.
4. Bulls must be led and ringed at the nose. Animals entering the show-ground area, in all respects, are at the risk of the owner. The Society will not be responsible for any accident which may occur through any animal exhibited, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. You are strongly advised to check your insurance cover on this point.
5. All Prizewinners in the Cattle Classes must take part in the Parade of Prize Animals or the Prizes will be withheld.
6. In order to discourage frivolous protests, every protest must be made in writing and sent to the Secretary within seven clear days after the date of the Show, and to be accompanied by a deposit of £50 to be returned, or retained, by the vote of the Committee, on consideration as to whether there was reasonable ground or not for the protest.
7. The Conditions attached to any Premium are applicable to all animals gaining a prize of whatever denomination.
8. If only one entry is received in any section, this section may be withdrawn. The entrant will be notified and the entry fee returned.
9. The winners of Cups, Trophies and/or Plaques must return them to the Society's office at Lane Farm or to the Society's appointed Jeweller, Mr W Philip, 6 Collin Hill, Kendal, on or before 1st July within the year following the Show, or in default of this requirement a penalty of £25 will be imposed.
These cups, etc, shall be the responsibility of the winner until they are in the hands of the Society or its appointed Jeweller. Proof of posting will be required if an article is lost or alleged to be lost in the post.
10. All cups should be considered to be 'perpetual' unless stated otherwise.
11. All exhibitors will be subject to the orders of the Society's officials. Abuse, physical or verbal, towards stewards and staff will not be tolerated and exhibitors or their assistants not obeying the directions of the Society's officers will render themselves liable to expulsion from the Showground.
12. In the event of what is considered by the Management Committee to be a serious contravention of the Rules, not apparent within the 7-day period under condition 6, the 7-day period need not apply.
13. A Disciplinary Committee consisting of the Referee, Chairman, Chief Executive and appropriate Chief Steward is empowered to represent the Society on matters relating to the Show on Show day and their decision shall be binding.
14. All persons entering an animal in a class covered by a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to it's Rules and disciplinary procedures including exclusion from exhibiting.

Extract from Rules of Society

1. This Society, established in 1799, for the purpose of improving the breed of stock and the management and cultivation of farms has for its objects the promotion of the interests of Agriculture in general and to combine and foster the interests of town and country.
- 5.1 Applicants for membership, having paid the current membership subscription, shall on Show Day have the rights and privileges of a member (save voting rights until voting membership is confirmed) and shall otherwise be bound by the rules bylaws and regulations of the Society for the time being.
7. Every subscriber of £27.50 a year and upwards may apply to be a Member of the Society. Subscriptions shall become due and paid by Show Day in each year, and any person whose application has not been approved shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting. No member shall be allowed to withdraw his name without giving notice in writing to the Chief Executive of his intention to do so previous to the 1st December in each year.
13. All conditions of competition framed by the Committee shall be as binding as these Rules, providing the same be in no way at variance therewith.
23. When a Premium or Prize is offered for any animal without expressing that it be in the hands of the Breeder such animal shall have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and located upon their premises for a period of not less than three calendar months immediately preceding the Show Day. Horses, sheep and pigs excepted.
24. No person (except in the case of a son succeeding his father, a widow her husband) shall be admitted to claim for the best managed farm until he has been in bona-fide occupation of such farm for three years at least. The Inspectors in making their awards shall have special regard to the improvements made by the Tenant as distinguished from those made by the Landlord.
25. If a person shall obtain a First Prize in any of the Farms and Stocks classes (classes 1–11) for two consecutive years, he shall not be entitled to compete again for the same Prize in the year immediately succeeding the date of the second award; and whenever such person shall again become a competitor, the inspectors shall direct their attention particularly to the improvements made on the farm during the last two years.
26. The word 'Farm' shall mean the entire holding or holdings of the competitor, being either proprietary occupier or tenant, when lying together or farmed from the same homestead, exclusive of woods, roads, rivers and high-lying grounds not adapted for ploughing, and whether or not farmed under different landlords or held under different agreements.
N.B. Inasmuch as it is impossible to frame this Rule so as to meet every case, the Committee shall have power, in the event of dispute to decide each case on its own merits, but in accordance as far as possible with the true intent and spirit of this Rule, and their decisions shall be final.
30. Any member knowingly making any false entry, or otherwise attempting to impose on the Society, shall not be allowed to continue as a member.
